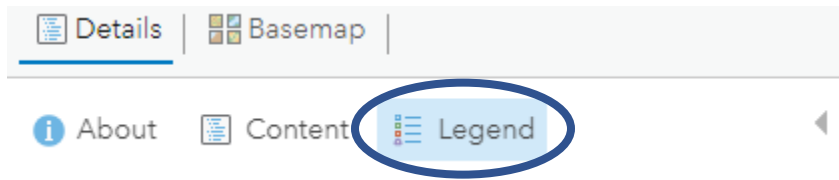


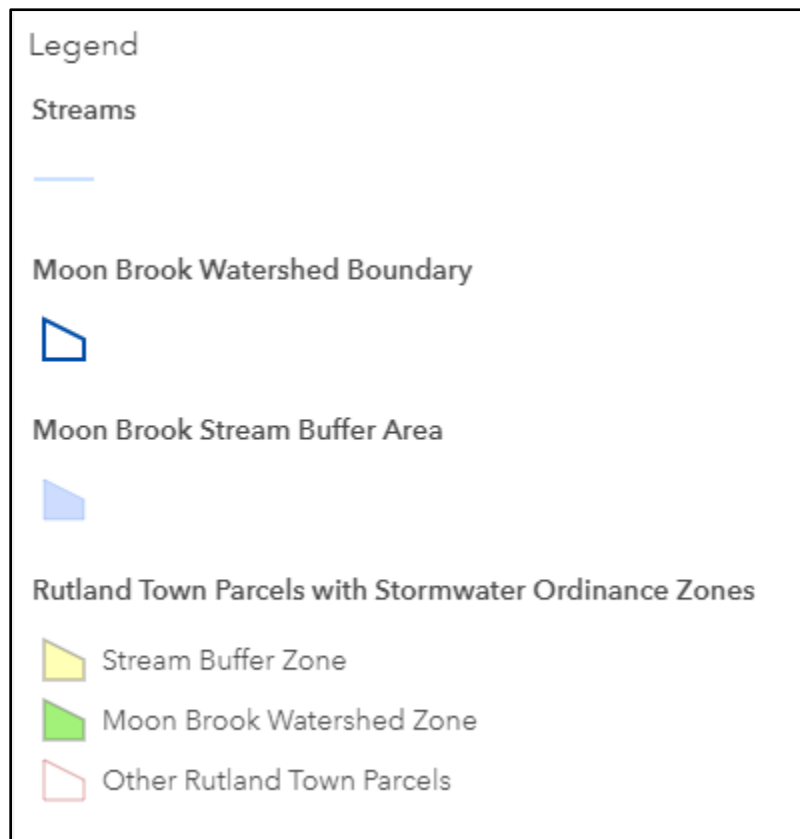

Quick Map Guide



- Legend
 - Click on the word *Legend* circled in blue on the above picture.

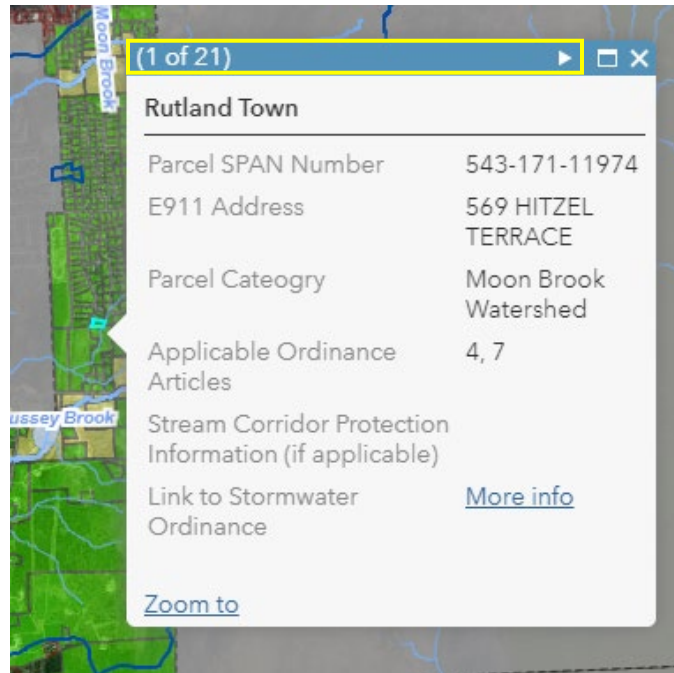


- A list should appear with names of different features shown on the map.
 - Each colored shape and line correspond to a visible layer.
- Searching for an Address



- Click on the box shown in the above picture that says "Find address or place"

- Type in the place or location you would like to see, and press enter.
- Querying a Parcel
 - To find data or information about a particular parcel, move your mouse over the parcel you would like to find out more about and click on it. A pop-up should appear like the one shown below.

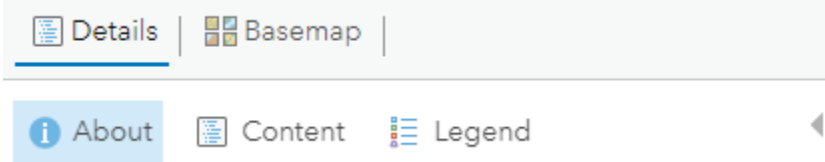


- Sometimes when the extent of the map is zoomed out and you click on a large selection of parcels, a navigation arrow will appear along with the total list selected. This is highlighted in a yellow box in the above picture.
- To move through each of the selected parcels or polygons, click on the arrow pointing right, circled in orange on the below picture.




- If you did not mean to click on multiple parcels, zoom in to click on and select just the one parcel you are interested in.

Detailed Web Map Instructions

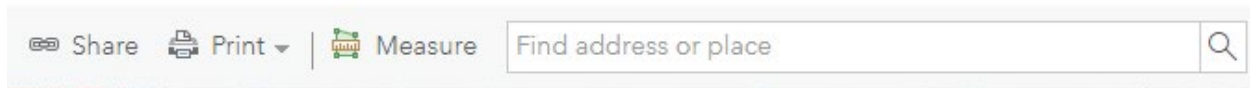


- Details Pane (Left Side of Map, Shown in Picture Above)
 - Clicking on the *About* tab will give more information about the Web Map including a short description, the creator, and a link under *More Details* that will bring the user to the webpage on ArcGIS Online.
 - The *Content* tab provides a list of selected and unselected feature layers that if checked will appear on the map.
 - Each feature under *Contents* has associated picto-buttons when the mouse is hovering over the desired feature layer.



 - The list with down arrow button corresponds to the individual legend or symbol and color of the feature layer.
 - The table-like or calendar button opens the attribute table where different properties and information of each layer is stored.
 - The colorful shapes button gives the user options to change what is shown on the map, based off the attributes present in the attribute table.
 - The three dots give two options that are helpful. *Zoom to* moves the frame of the map to the extent of the selected feature layer, and *Transparency* changes the visibility of the selected layer.
 - The *Legend* highlights the symbols and colors of the selected feature layers, and identifies whether they are points, lines, or polygons.
 - Basemap Button to the right of the Details button allows the user to change the Basemap to any of listed options that ArcGIS Online provides.

- The floating buttons to the right of the Details Pane, shown in the image on the right, provides useful options for navigating the map.
 - Plus sign = zooms in
 - Minus sign = zooms out
 - Home or House button brings the frame of the map back to the original extent.
 - Scope button navigates the map to the user's location.



- The bar on the upper right-hand corner has multiple options for sharing and locating on the web map.
 - Clicking the *Share* button provides a public link that can be copied.
 - *Print* takes the user to a new page that chooses the extent to print and provides a search bar for locating addresses and places of interest.
 - Clicking *Measure* changes the mouse pointer to click points for drawing lines or polygons in which to measure the underlying distance and area.
 - The search bar that says “Find address or place” can be used to find a desired location within the map by clicking in the bar and typing an address or place.

- Clicking on a parcel or polygon directly brings up a pop-up box with specific attribute information for the selected area.
- On pop-ups such information as a unique identifier, dimensional characteristics (e.g., length, area, etc.), links, and information related what the map is conveying is often shown.
